#### What you will do in the role

- Develop a network complement of extended family and community support providers within the Agency's jurisdiction.
- Develop and deliver culturally appropriate, and comprehensive orientations for placement providers.
- Assist the Alternative Care Team in the development of and/or contract with support services, clinical or traditional resources, community partnerships, internal support groups and training.
- Provide training to members of our frontline teams to apply family finding and community outreach tools.
- Participate in child protection home visits to assess potential respite, in-home and out of home support and placement options.
- Complete assessments of identified extended family and community placements and document the information gathered.
- Carry kinship service cases, support relationships between the kinship families and immediate family members as appropriate.
- Develop and ensure consistent adherence to agency protocols for the placement of a child(ren) in kinship service, and extended family placements.
- Routinely review and evaluate the quality and effectiveness of the children/youth's current placement in collaboration with team members ensuring all supports are in place to address identified needs.
- Maintain records and produce program reports as per all related standards.
